The Cub Scout Program

Since 1930, tens of millions of boys have joined Cub Scouts. It is a year-round family program designed for boys who are in the first grade through fifth grade (or ages seven through eleven).

The ten purposes of Cub Scouting are:

1. Character Development
2. Spiritual Growth
3. Good Citizenship
4. Sportsmanship and Fitness
5. Family Understanding
6. Respectful Relationships
7. Personal Achievement
8. Friendly Service
9. Fun and Adventure
10. Preparation for Boy Scouts



Tiger Cub Scouts

An introduction to scouting for 1st grade boys (or age 7) and their parents. With 5 achievement areas, the Tiger Cub and his adult partner work to earn the Tiger Cub badge through indoor and outdoor activities. A Tiger Cub graduates to...

Wolf Scouts

Boys who have completed the 1st grade (or age 8) may join the Wolf Den. To earn the wolf badge, a boy must pass 12 achievements involving simple physical and mental skills. A Wolf Cub graduates to...

Bear Scouts

The Bear badge may be earned by boys who have completed 2nd grade (or age 9). The boy works closely with parents, leaders, and other boys to complete 12 achievements in four areas to earn the Bear badge. A Bear Cub graduates to...

Webelos Scouts

This is an 18 month program for boys who have completed third grade (or age 10). This is the transition from the Cub Scouts to the Boy Scouts. As he completes the requirements in the Webelos book, he will work on activity badges and become familiar with Boy Scout requirements - all leading to the Arrow of Light award. A second year Webelos graduates to Boy Scouts.
